Janet Blunt's MSS are in the Library of EFDSS in London, which is the source of this transcript. This carol is dated by Janet Blunt as having been 'collected' in 1916, with a note that William Walton in his youth had sung it 60-70 years previously. "It was used in Adderbury Church, with orchestra ~ ~ Violin's, Clarinet, Bass viols, 2 flutes & "the old sarpint" (bassoon??). All on west gallery. ~ ~ And by the Waits, singing round." Only the first two verses have been recorded as being sung, although the other three are included from the Key's original [Carol 3, Book 2].

Dynamics as recorded by Janet Blunt, with a note that the Duet speed was crotchet = 63-66, and the Chorus speed, crochet = 126. No indications given as to repeats.

As in the Sussex version, the key has been changed from Key's original C major to G major, and the tune transferred to the Treble line.
